West Africa Industrialisation, Manufacturing & Trade (IMT) Summit & Exhibition 2026: 3–5 March Landmark Centre, Lagos.

The Nigerian–Indonesian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (NICCI) played a prominent role at the West Africa Industrialisation, Manufacturing & Trade (IMT) Summit & Exhibition 2026, held 3–5 March at the Landmark Centre in Lagos.

Organised by DMG events, the summit brought together government leaders, diplomats, manufacturers, investors, development partners and policy stakeholders to advance industrial growth and trade integration across West Africa.

It opened with welcoming remarks from **Wemimo Oyelana**, Country Director of dmg events Nigeria. The keynote address was delivered by **Gautier Mignot**, Ambassador of the European Union to Nigeria and ECOWAS. High-level policy presentations were given by **John Ugochukwu Uwajumogu**, Special Adviser to the President on Industry, Trade and Investment, and **John Owan Enoh**, Honourable Minister of State for Industry.

The international exhibition featured over 250 companies showcasing manufacturing equipment, agro-processing technologies, energy systems and logistics solutions.

In the technical seminar segment, NICCI President **Mr. Ishmael Balogun** delivered a strategic presentation titled “Building Sustainable Industrial Ecosystems through Nigeria–Indonesia Strategic Partnerships.” He emphasised interconnected ecosystems supported by policy stability, infrastructure and private-sector participation, drawing lessons from Indonesia and proposing practical collaboration pathways including agro-industrial corridors, technology transfer, machinery collaboration and cross-border financing.

NICCI’s participation reinforced its mission to strengthen Nigeria–Indonesia economic cooperation and advance preparations for the Nigeria–Indonesia Investment and Trade Forum (NIITF) 2026.



PEBEC 3rd Foreign Direct Investors Roundtable & Strategic Engagement – 5 March

The Nigerian-Indonesian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (NICCI) was represented by its President, **Mr. Ishmael Balogun**, at the 3rd Existing Foreign Direct Investors (FDI) Roundtable convened by the Presidential Enabling Business Environment Council (PEBEC) Secretariat.

The high-level forum, held at the Banquet Hall of the Presidential Villa, brought together foreign missions, international and domestic investors, organised private sector leaders, and senior government officials to strengthen Nigeria's investment climate and ease of doing business.

Opening the session on behalf of **Vice President Kashim Shettima**, **Ibrahim Hadejia**, **Deputy Chief of Staff to the President**, reaffirmed the Federal Government's commitment to a stable, transparent, and competitive business environment. **Zahrah Mustapha Audu**, Director-General of PEBEC, highlighted key reform milestones including the

Business Facilitation Act, port reforms, and digital automation of government processes.

The roundtable featured presentations and interactive discussions with **Zacch Adedeji** (Nigeria Revenue Service), **Bashir Adewale Adeniyi** (Comptroller-General, Nigeria Customs Service), **Olutunji Rilwan Disu** (Inspector-General, Nigeria Police Force), and Taiwo Oyedele (Chairman, Presidential Committee on Fiscal Policy and Tax Reforms and Minister of State for Finance-designate). Private sector perspectives were shared by Jani Ibrahim, President of NACCIMA.

NICCI's participation reflects the Chamber's continued commitment to promoting international trade, strengthening bilateral economic relations, and supporting policy frameworks that encourage sustainable investment flows into Nigeria.



Nigeria-Indonesia High-Level Bilateral Engagement – 6 March

In a significant demonstration of its core mandate to facilitate international trade and diplomatic collaboration, the Nigeria Indonesia Chamber of Commerce and Industry (NICCI), under the leadership of its President Mr. Ishmael Balogun, facilitated a landmark high-level meeting between the Honourable Minister of State for Regional Development, H.E. Uba Maigari Ahmadu, and the Indonesian Ambassador to Nigeria, H.E. Bambang Suharto.

The strategic engagement was convened to explore areas of mutual cooperation between Nigeria and Indonesia, particularly within sectors aligned with regional development priorities. Discussions centred on unlocking investment opportunities, strengthening bilateral partnerships, and fostering sustainable economic collaboration across critical sectors: Food and Agriculture, Renewable Energy (Power Generation), Infrastructure and Utilities, Mining, Healthcare, Digital Infrastructure, and Financial Services.

The meeting was further strengthened by the presence of key stakeholders, including the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Regional Development, Dr. Mary Ogbe, the Minister Counselor at the Indonesian Embassy, Mr. Harry Khairul, as well as Special Advisers to the Honourable Minister. This engagement highlights NICCI's strategic role as a bridge between governments and the private sector, facilitating dialogues that translate into tangible economic opportunities.

NICCI participated in the C&C Networking Brunch & Unveiling, a thoughtfully curated engagement platform designed to bring together corporate leaders, entrepreneurs, and industry stakeholders within an atmosphere of purposeful connection and collaboration.

Strategic Visit to ARISE Industrial Platform Remo – 27 March

The Nigerian–Indonesian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (NICCI) reinforced its commitment to advancing industrial partnerships through a strategic visit to the ARISE Industrial Platform Remo in Ogun State.

The NICCI delegation, led by President Mr. Ishmael Adegorioye Balogun and Board Member Mr. Kingsley Odianna (President of BGL Group), was received by Mr. Prasad Sane, senior official of ARISE.

Mr. Sane delivered a detailed presentation on ARISE's integrated industrial model spanning ports, logistics, and infrastructure services. He highlighted ongoing and planned developments across Ogun, Enugu, Cross River, Imo, Niger, and Kano states, positioning the Remo Free Zone as a world-class hub with streamlined regulations and investor-friendly infrastructure.
